In The Classroom or Auditorium:

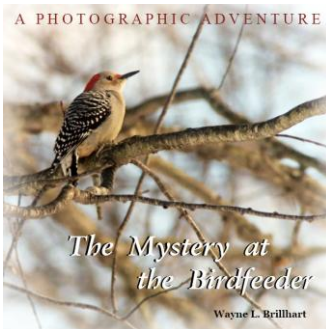
